
PURPOSE OF THE AWARD

The 'Space for Sustainability Award' will be rewarded annually to the best Project Idea that integrates application areas focusing on sustainability linked to space

AWARD PROCESS

- EISC 2012 plenary session: Launch of the website
- January 2013: Opening the registrations and submissions
- 15 June 2013: Registration closure
- 8 July 2013: Jury meeting
- 18 Projects Ideas / 9 nationalities / age average: 23 years old / 1 winner and 1 special mention of the jury

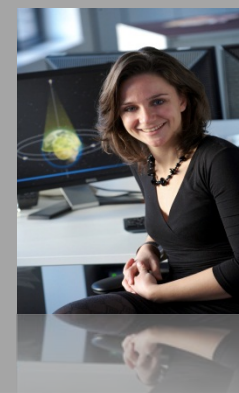


MAXIME PUTEAUX 'Mars 4 Earth' / Winner of the Award

- ✓ Stimulate and develop innovation for sustainable application through the prism of a Mars human exploration's requirements

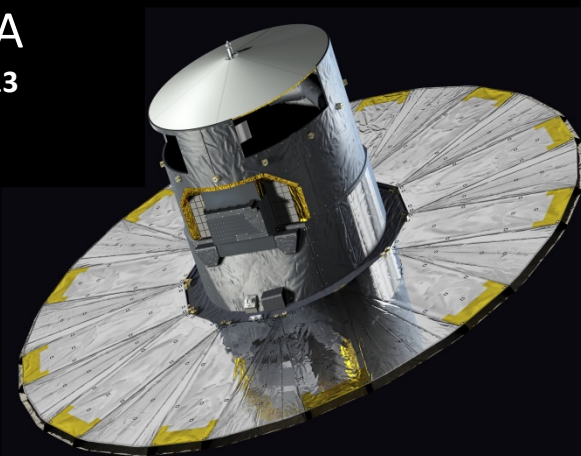
JEANNETTE HEILIGERS 'Eyes on the Poles' / Special Mention of the Jury

Gaia will be launched from Europe's Spaceport in French Guiana the 20th of November 2013



Gaia is to chart a three-dimensional map of more than one billion stars of our Galaxy, in the process revealing the composition, formation and evolution of it.
It will also provide a number of stringent new tests of general relativity and cosmology.
